


USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

COVID-19 Guidelines Mandatory Requirements for Competition Participants

- 1) Access
 - a) Participants are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the show grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher may not enter the show grounds.
 - b) A participant is a rider, owner, trainer, coach or groom. These are the only individuals permitted on the show grounds. A minor is allowed one (1) parent to accompany them.
 - c) Every person on the show grounds must sign a USEF Waiver and Release of Liability before entering the show grounds.
 - d) Anyone who enters the show grounds must wear a wristband at all times and it must be visible. Sharing wristbands with unauthorized individuals will result in disqualification and the participant and individual(s) will be asked to leave the show grounds immediately.
 - e) Participants are required to wear a face mask/face covering at all times while on the show grounds, except when mounted on a horse.* Proper wearing of a face mask/face covering is to cover your nose and mouth. Face shields without a face mask/face covering are not in compliance following the guidelines of USEF.
*A participant may choose to wear a face mask/face covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while competing.
 - f) Anyone who:
 - i) Exhibits COVID-19 symptoms
 - ii) Has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or
 - iii) Has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks cannot enter or stay on the competition grounds.
 - iv) If a person starts running a temperature or begins to feel ill during the show, they should go to the Show Medic first, then leave the competition grounds immediately and seek medical attention.
- 2) Social Distancing/Participant Protocols
 - a) Participants must comply with social distancing requirements at all times while on the show grounds.
 - b) A minimum of six (6) feet is the separation required and a face mask/face covering must still be worn at all times. **There are no exceptions when unmounted.**
- 3) Hand Washing
 - a) Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day. Hand wash stations and hand sanitizer are positioned throughout the show grounds.
- 4) Spectators
 - a) Spectators are not permitted on the show grounds at any time.
 - b) Once competition rides are completed for the day, the rider and everyone associated with the rider should vacate the show grounds.
- 5) Warm-up Arenas
 - a) No more than eight (8) riders are allowed in any warm-up or competition arena at any given time on Friday. No exceptions. Warm-up arenas open at 7:00am on Friday.
 - b) During the competition, arrive with your horse to the warm-up arena no sooner than 45 minutes before your scheduled ride time. If you arrive sooner than this approved time you will be asked to leave the warm-up arena.
- 6) Eating or Drinking During the Competition
 - a) To eat or drink, an individual must move far enough away from others to minimize the possibility of being within six (6) feet of any other individual before lowering the face mask/face covering to eat or drink. The face mask/face covering must be immediately replaced over the nose and mouth when finished.
- 7) Golf Carts
 - a) Face masks/face coverings must be worn by the driver and passengers at all times.
 - b) Individuals are allowed to be seated together while being transported by golf cart (or similar four-wheeled transport vehicle), but capacity may not exceed the number of seats on the cart or vehicle and all individuals must wear face masks or face coverings. Congregating on or around a parked or stationary golf cart or vehicle is prohibited.

New Important Equine Vaccination Requirements for Competitors

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations: name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse: name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine: and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/2015 Effective 12/1/2015.

Hair Raising Rules and Information

1. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

2. MEMBERSHIPS: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

2a. USEF/USDF HORSE RECORDING/REGISTRATION: Proof of USEF Horse Recording and USDF Horse Registration (annual or life registration) is required for USDF-GAIG regional championship qualifying classes. For non USDF-qualifying classes, USDF Horse identification Number (HID) is required, as a minimum. Proof of recording/registration must be provided with entry form.

3. 2021 GAIG/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING REQUIREMENTS: In order to qualify for a Regional Championship, horse/rider combinations may qualify by earning a minimum of two qualifying scores at two official GREAT AMERICAN/USDF recognized competitions from two different judges in any region. Riders may ride in Qualifying classes both days. See USDF ad in this prize list or go to www.usdf.org to find the minimum qualifying scores required for each level. Non US Citizens may ride in Qualifying classes.

4. AMATEURS & JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDERS: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. All riders entering the Amateur classes must possess or have applied for an USEF Amateur Card prior to riding in the class. All riders in Amateur Divisions must have a USEF Amateur Card to show in the Amateur Division. Cards may be applied for at the show office. Individuals are eligible as JR/YR until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

5. MANAGEMENT: Show Management has the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by show management and their decision is final. Show Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept

conditionally or to cancel any entries, cancel or combine any unfilled classes or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors, to change rings or rotate judges or make any changes required by circumstances.

6. ENTRY PROCEDURE: ON-LINE ENTRIES ONLY ACCEPTED—Visit friendsoflisa.org for PL and EqEntries.com opening day to enter online. The NEW USEF Entry Agreement, which is the second page of the entry form and requires signatures for everyone listed on the entry, a negative Coggins and flu/rhino vaccination records, if required, may be uploaded in Equestrian Entries and submitted with the show entry, e-mailed separately to Show Secretary prior to your email receipt confirming your Equestrian Entries on-line entry. You must also upload the NEW USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form, for the rider, owner, trainer and coach as listed on the entry form and the groom. The Secretary must receive these waivers before the show. The Waivers may be uploaded in Equestrian Entries and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. Entries without current and correct association number verification will be considered incomplete and the membership verification fee applies for each entry. Please note the NEW USEF Entry Agreement and USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Forms may be found in this Prize List or found at <https://www.usef.org/media/covid19-toolkit>. Management requires that all entries be created and paid for on EqEntries.com. If you do not already have a user account with Equestrian Entries, please sign up. There is a 5% fee plus a \$5 handling charge. There is no fee to join Equestrian Entries, to create an entry. Visit www.eqentries.com. For questions about the service email, helpme@eqentries.com. No telephone, mail, fax or email entries will be accepted. ALL FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ON-LINE ENTRIES. Entries without payment in full will not be accepted. On-line Entries must be received by October 15th, 2020. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted only if submitted on-line accompanied by a \$50 late entry fee on a space-available basis. Only one horse/rider combination per entry form. Entries must be complete including association numbers, mailing address, contact information and signature of each owner, rider, trainer, and coach if applicable. Minor exhibitors require signature of parent or guardian (Trainer signature is not allowed). COPIES OF ALL MEMBERSHIP CARDS SHOULD ACCOMPANY YOUR ENTRIES. A \$20 member verification fee applies if you don't send them in!

7. CHANGE FEE: For any changes of classes after the schedule has been issued or changes in riders, there will be a \$15 change fee.

8. SCRATCHES AND REFUNDS: Entries cancelled before the closing date will be refunded minus a \$50 administration fee. There are NO REFUNDS AFTER ORIGINAL POSTED CLOSING DATE. Show entries that are no shows are still responsible for entry fees. Class no-shows that have not notified management, the rider/horse will be considered scratched from the show and their rides will be filled with horse/riders on the wait list.

9. LATE ENTRIES: All entries must be received by Thursday, October 15th or they will be considered late and incur a \$50 late fee.

10. RETURNED CHECKS OR DECLINED CREDIT CARDS: Returned checks or declined credit cards will be charged \$50 or 10% of the unpaid balance whichever is greater. Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full. Prize money checks will not be released to anyone with an outstanding balance owed from a returned check or declined credit card.

11. HAZARDOUS WEATHER/ACTS OF GOD/ACCIDENT/EMERGENCY POLICY: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to Hazardous Weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to Hazardous Weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

12. UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid show balance will be billed for these charges and a \$50 billing fee may be added to the amount of the bill. Until charges are paid, any prize money won will be withheld and future entries of the rider and owner will be returned.

13. RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be available on www.foxvillage.com on the Monday before the show and also on www.FriendsofLisa.org E-mail addresses are required and must be active. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after reviewing the schedule. Please turn off your spam filter for FoxVillage.com and FriendsofLisa.org USEF GR830

14. SHOW OFFICE: Show office will not be open for check in or entry issues. Everything will be handled by text, phone or email. Entry packets will be at your stall when you arrive.

15. TESTS: Current versions of the USEF tests for Opportunity and Training through Fourth Level tests will be used, as well as current editions of the USDF Introductory and Pas de Deux tests and current editions of the FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediare I, II, B, Grand Prix and Grand Prix Special. For reference, you may find copies on each Governing Organizations' website.

16. SCORED TESTS: Tests will be given only to riders or their agents and only AFTER results are posted and placing established. Any issues concerning scores or placings must be brought to the attention of the Horse Show Secretary WITHIN ONE HOUR OF THE END OF THE SHOW DAY. Scores and placings will become final at that time.

17. RESULTS: Results will be available on www.foxvillage.com and later on www.FriendsofLisa.org.

18. PRIZES: Prize for national show classes will be awarded for first place and ribbons for first through third place will be given. Six show High Point Champion ribbons and prizes will be given to each winner in the Open, AA, JR/YR divisions for Training through Fourth Level and FEI. Special awards will be given for: The Sara Eigner Memorial Perpetual Trophy, IALHA High Point, CDS High Scoring Pony, KWPN-NA High Point.

19. SPOOKTACULAR COSTUME FREESTYLE EXHIBITION: Horse and riders participating in Saturday's exhibition classes are exempt from USEF and USDF horse recording and membership requirements. Helmets are required to ride in the exhibition classes. Ribbons to 3rd place and prize money will be awarded in one group for all divisions including Pas De Deux. \$600 split 1st-\$300, 2nd -\$200 and 3rd-\$100. A special award will also be given to the best overall costume. **Prize money will be distributed to the person who paid for the entry.** Checks must be cashed within 6 months of show. Lost or stolen checks will not be reissued after 6 months.

20. GROUNDS FEE: A \$60/day grounds fee must be paid for horses that are not stabled during the show.

21. NON-COMPETING HORSES: No non compete horses will be allowed this year at Spooktacular.

22. BRIDLE NUMBERS: Bridle numbers for competition and schooling horses must be worn at all times when a horse is being hand-walked, exercised, ridden or tied to a trailer.

23. SHOW AND WARM UP ARENAS: All tests will be ridden in 20 x 60 meter arenas with sand footing. Large warm up sand arenas. No one on foot is allowed in the warm-up arenas. Arenas must be vacated while equipment is being used. Lunging is allowed in specified areas and time only. On the days of competition, riders may ride in the competition arenas after the show has ended Saturday and Sunday. Riders are NOT allowed in the competition arenas before the show start Saturday and Sunday, but may hand walk around the outside of the court until 7:00AM each day. All arenas are open for schooling on Friday October 23rd.

24. FREESTYLE TEST AND SOUND CHECK: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of **63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition**, Federation Licensed or FEI recognized Dressage Competition, or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. Riders must deliver music on good quality CDs at check-in for freestyle music. Sound checks will be conducted Friday evening and 30 minutes before the first ride in the morning on Saturday and Sunday.

25. MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a

minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

26. PROPERTY DAMAGE: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage occurred by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other property on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly.

27. MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold CDS, USDF, USEF and Friends of Lisa, LLC harmless for injury to such minors. No minor entry will be accepted unless signed by a parent or guardian. The signatures of instructors, agents or other non-related persons will not be acceptable. All juniors/minors must be supervised by their parents/guardians or authorized agent while at or on the show grounds whether riding or on foot.

28. DOGS: Dogs must be leashed on show grounds, including stabling area. Any dog becoming a nuisance, the owner will be asked to remove the dog from the grounds.

29. FOOD: Food and beverages are available for purchase on the showgrounds at Pony Espresso Café.

30. RVs: RV parking is available at the showgrounds for the entire weekend Thursday through Sunday. Water and electric are available, no septic. Rate is \$200 for the weekend. Please check in at show office to pick up parking sign to be placed on dashboard while at the show.

31. STABLING: Stabling is in permanent wood barns. Stall are 10x10 with Dutch doors. No automatic waterers. Water spigots are located in each barn aisle. Water bucket and hoses must be provided by competitor. Stabling is \$200 for the show weekend. No Straw is permitted-only shavings for bedding. NO REMOVAL OF STALL BOARDS ALLOWED. Fines of \$100/board will apply.

Premium Stabling Concierge Service can be ordered with entry. Concierge service includes a bedded stall with 4 bags of shavings and a welcome bag of treats for \$100. Stall is bedded and ready prior to your arrival. Please no smoking in the barn area! Deposit all manure in designated area and not in barn aisle itself.

32. HOSE/WASHING: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water. Violators will be fined \$50 for each violation.

33. SAFETY REGULATIONS: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open-flame devices are not permitted within the stables.

34. SHARPS CONTAINERS: Each barn has one sharps container per 50 horses (per USEF GR 1210.4). Show Management may fine any individuals including trainers, exhibitors, owners, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

35. FEED AND BEDDING: After initial order on entry form, all orders must be made through the barn manager only. Competitors can bring their own hay and shavings but cannot have deliveries made other than through show management. All feed and bedding at the show will be handled by our barn manager Diana Madruga. She can be reached at: stabling@friendsoflisa.org /619.244.1934

36. STALL CHART: Stall chart will be posted on the show website at www.FriendsofLisa.org before the show and on barn aisle ends.

37. NIGHT WATCH: Night watch will be provided by Tom Meyers Night Watch. To sign up, contact Tom at 530-263-2688 or register at his tent in the stabling area.

38. PONY MEASUREMENT: Competitors wishing to have their scores count for National Pony Cup Champion and the CDS High Scoring Pony awards must include a current pony measurement card with their entry. If a pony needs to be measured, the owner or agent must notify show management in writing at least 10 days before the start of the competition. Competitor is responsible for making arrangements with the show's TD and on-call Vet and is also responsible for all Vet charges and any rental fees incurred for the rental of a measuring stick if required. Please call the show secretary to arrange for a Pony Measurement.

39. NATIONAL DRESSAGE PONY CUP AND CDS HIGH SCORING PONY AWARDS: Pony Test of Choice classes will be used to determine the National Dressage Pony Show Champion and the CDS High Scoring Pony award. Pony measurement cards will be required to win. Awards will be mailed to winners.

40. INTRODUCTORY A, B, C CLASSES: are not recognized by USEF. For horses and riders only in Intro classes, USEF and USDF membership and horse registration are not required. Scores earned in Intro classes may not be applied toward USEF and USDF awards or programs.

41. OPPORTUNITY CLASSES: will be Training Level Tests 1 & 2 and First Level Tests 1 & 2. These classes are for novice riders and/or young horses new to the sport. Membership in USEF, USDF & CDS is not required. If rider is a member of CDS, scores will be used to qualify for CDS Championships. Opportu-

nity classes are still subject to the CDFA Drug Testing Fee of \$5 per horse. Horse and rider can also compete in the national show classes. Doing so requires association memberships and the required fees.

42. PROTESTS: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 with the secretary of the show, and that sum will be forfeited to the horse show if not sustained. All protests must be filed in writing, signed by the protester, and filed with the show secretary within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation.

43. COVID-19 SAFETY PRECAUTIONS: FRIENDS OF LISA will comply with the guidelines regarding COVID-19 as set forth by USEF at the time of the show. Please review the Mandatory Requirements for Competition Participants shown on the opposite page. As the show date approaches, we will inform participants about any additional guidelines they need to be aware of.

Please make sure to familiarize yourself with the USEF COVID-19 Toolkit and understand your responsibilities as a participant in this show, <https://www.usef.org/media/coronavirus-resources>.

44. CALIFORNIA COGGINS/HEALTH CERTIFICATE LAW:

Equine residing in California: A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required for California equine. Equine entering California: All equine entering California must be accompanied by a current negative Coggins test for EIA conducted within 12 months of the show date, flu/rhino vaccinations within 6 months of the show date. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry into the state.

45. HELMETS: DR 120.6. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hatcovers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

2020 USEF SAFE SPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS TO COMPETE

Reminder:

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.USEF.org.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Will you be showing for the first time in 2020 at the Spooktacular?

You will need a 2020 USEF & USDF membership or pay the non-member fees. If you register for a USDF & USEF Membership online at www.usdf.org and www.usef.org for the Spooktacular, be sure to check the 2020 membership box NOT the 2021 membership box. Otherwise the system will automatically default to 2021. You will not be able to use the 2021 membership for the Spooktacular and will not be able to print out your membership cards until December 1st when the new season begins!!!!

2021 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2021 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E.
